Second Review of Scottish Parliament Boundaries

3. Review of Scottish Parliament Constituencies and Regions

The Scottish Parliament Review commenced on 1 September. Mr Hinds updated the Minister that Boundaries Scotland plan to publish initial proposals for consultation in early 2023. The final proposals are to be submitted in May 2025 as set out in legislation.

There was a discussion about the importance of a non-partisan approach to the Parliament's consideration of the proposals.

The Deputy First Minister met with the Presiding Officer in March to discuss engaging with MSPs on this and, following that meeting, the clerks of the Standards Committee have made contact with Boundaries Scotland.

Mr Adam will speak to the Chief Executive of the Scottish Parliament, David McGill, to discuss the Parliament's consideration of the Islands Review and look ahead to the legislation for the SP Review.
